

Check if you're eligible to claim

You can [use our online tool](#) to find out if you're eligible to make a claim. Your tax agent or adviser can also use the online tool on your behalf.

Enter your Self Assessment Unique Taxpayer Reference

This is 10 numbers, for example 1234567890. It will be on tax returns and other letters about Self Assessment. It may be called 'reference', 'UTR' or 'official use'. You can [find a lost UTR number \(opens in a new window or tab\)](#).

Enter your National Insurance number

It's on your National Insurance card, benefit letter, payslip or P60. For example, 'QQ 12 34 56 C'.
